Regulations on Local Communities of the Technotheism Community

This Regulation defines the status, procedure for creation, principles of operation and governance of local communities of the Technotheism Community (hereinafter referred to as the Community), as well as regulates their interaction with the central structure of the Community.

This document is mandatory for all local communities, their coordinators, and participants, and operates in conjunction with the Charter of the Community, the Code of Ethics, the Data Protection Regulation, and other internal normative acts.

1. General Provisions

1.1. Local communities are territorial associations of members of the Community and function on the principles of voluntary participation, coordination, and adherence to the ideological and ethical foundations of Technotheism.

1.2. Communities are not legal entities and carry out their activities on behalf of the Technotheism Community.

1.3. The purpose of the communities' activities is to create an environment for the intellectual, cultural, and social development of participants, the promotion of the ideas of Technotheism, as well as the practical implementation of the mission and goals of the Community on the ground.

2. Creation of a Local Community

2.1. The creation of a local community may be initiated by any member or group of members residing in the same region.

2.2. To apply for the creation of a community, the following are required:

- A minimum of 20 active participants;
- Holding an inaugural offline meeting;
- Voting for a candidate for coordinator, approved by at least 2/3 of those present;
- Appointment of a deputy coordinator at the same meeting or by agreement with the central structure;
- Preparation and submission of an application form with the meeting protocol to the central structure of the Community.

2.3. The decision to establish a community is made by the central body of the Community.

3. Community Coordinators

3.1. Each local community is managed by a coordinator, approved in the established manner.

3.2. Rights and responsibilities of the coordinator:

- Represent the community in interaction with the central structure;
- Ensure regular meetings and events are held;
- Monitor compliance with the norms and regulations of the Community;
- Delegate tasks and form an active team;
- Not use community resources for personal purposes;
- Ensure the maintenance of financial and organizational reporting.

3.3. The coordinator's powers remain valid until the next elections or until the decision of the central body to replace the coordinator.

3.4. In the event of the coordinator's inability to perform their duties, the deputy temporarily assumes their functions.

4. Motivation and Participation

4.1. The Community supports and encourages the contribution of coordinators and activists through:

- Recognition and award programs;
- Access to training resources and events;
- Opportunities for advancement within the structure of the Community;
- Gamification and an activity level system.

4.2. Admission of new members is carried out on a voluntary basis with mandatory familiarization with the mission, principles, and Code of Ethics. Newcomers are encouraged to undergo an introductory presentation.

4.3. In the event of a participant's conflictual behavior, the coordinator initiates an internal review with the possibility of issuing a warning, restricting participation, or exclusion if necessary.

5. Interaction Between Communities

5.1. Local communities may unite to hold joint events, campaigns, educational and cultural initiatives.

5.2. Experience exchange and mentoring between communities are encouraged, including the creation of temporary coordination groups.

6. Growth and Scaling

6.1. The growth of communities is carried out organically through the involvement of new participants and active work.

6.2. Upon reaching 100 or more active participants, the community may be divided into several cells with their own coordinators.

6.3. The merger of small communities is possible at the initiative of coordinators with the approval of the central structure.

7. Financing

7.1. Primary funding is carried out centrally from the funds accumulated by the Community.

7.2. Allocation of funds is made upon the coordinator's request indicating the goals and justification of needs.

7.3. Communities are entitled to conduct fundraising events subject to approval by the central structure.

7.4. All financial reporting is provided by the coordinator as part of regular reports.

8. Communication

8.1. Communication between communities and the central structure is carried out through official channels – secure chats, the Community platform, video calls, etc.

8.2. Coordinators receive access to task systems, trackers, and methodological materials.

8.3. All members may participate in forums and open sessions of the Community.

9. Violations and Liability

9.1. Violation of the Regulation, the Code of Ethics, or other regulations of the Community entails sanctions:

- Warning;
- Temporary restriction of activity;
- Suspension of a coordinator;
- Dissolution of a community.

9.2. The decision to apply sanctions is made by the central body of the Community.

10. Final Provisions

10.1. This Regulation enters into force from the moment of its approval by the governing body of the Community.

10.2. Amendments and additions to the Regulation are made in agreement with the governing body.

10.3. This Regulation applies to all local communities operating in the territory of any state.
