**Regulations on the Voting Procedure of the
Technotheism Council**

1. General Provisions

1.1. This document regulates the voting process in the Technotheism Council (hereinafter - the Council), including rules for decision-making and the procedure for exercising the right to vote.

1.2. The purpose of voting is to ensure effective decision-making necessary for the strategic management of the Community.

1.3. Voting may be conducted both in-person and remotely using digital platforms.

2. Number of Votes of Council Members

2.1. Each member of the Council has 1 vote.

3. Voting Procedure

3.1. Voting is initiated by the Community managers or by the majority of the Council members.

3.2. A decision is considered adopted if at least **two-thirds** of the total number of Council votes are cast in favor.

3.3. If a decision does not receive the required number of votes, it is rejected. It may be sent for further discussion and repeated voting at the next Council meeting.

3.4. Each Council member is given the opportunity to express their opinion before voting.

4. Right of Veto

4.1. Community managers have the right to impose a **veto** on any decision adopted by the Council if it contradicts the fundamental principles, strategic goals, or threatens the stability of the organization.

4.2. In case of a veto, the issue is returned for revision and reconsideration by the Council or excluded from voting.

5. Voting Format and Recording

5.1. Voting may be conducted:

- In-person at a Council meeting;
- Remotely via secure digital platforms;
- Only openly.

5.2. All voting results are recorded in the minutes of the Council meetings.

5.3. Extraordinary voting may be initiated by the Community managers or by at least half of the Council members.

6. Final Provisions

6.1. This regulation comes into force from the moment of its approval and regulates the voting process in the Council.

6.2. All amendments and additions to this regulation are subject to mandatory discussion and approval in the prescribed manner.

6.3. The voting process is based on the principles of transparency, objectivity, and efficiency in decision-making in the interests of the Community.
